Land Use/ Zoning

Will you support retaining zoning regulations that subject development of big box stores to public land review in most NYC neighborhoods? Yes_ I think all large construction projects should be subject to public land review. public land review process must not be allowed to become a political tool for those factions that favor or oppose Big Box Stores. The political issue of big box stores must be determined on the merits. Will you support legislation enabling the city to force violators to comply with Zoning Resolution and Building Code violations? Yes Violators must be made to comply or face serious penalties, especially when significant violations that put people at risk are in question. Will you support legislation authorizing City Council review of BSA decisions? Yes_____ No In order to prevent a logiam, I would support council review of BSA decisions when a request is formally made by the local Community Board. This would give Community Boards some real power. How do you envision the role of community boards in planning for neighborhood growth, budgeting and quality of life issues. See my response above. As a former member of Community Board 13, I feel Community Boards are the eyes and ears of the community. For the most part they get it right, but on occasions I have seen decisions made based on emotions and not fact. The local community boards are a KEY COMPONENT IN PROTECTING A COMMUNITY'S QUALITY OF LIFE. Building and Code Enforcement Will you sponsor legislation-called for by the Queens Civic Congress—to give the city authority to issue summons by DOB, FDNY and HPD to property owners who refuse accesss to their properties where a complaint of an illegal No Of course, provided constitutional protections of access have been followed. Would you rescind the Department of Building's Rules 105-03 and 105-04 which limit challenges by the public to new construction for a period of 45 days after the issuance of work permits? Yes___ __No Yes, I would rescind this or work with local CB's to come up with a time frame that all can agree with. Water Rates Will you sponsor legislation to abolish the NYC Water Board whose only function seems to be to raise revenue for whichever Mayor happens to occupy City Hall? Yes___ No NYC Council has no jurisdiction and cannot abolish the Water Board without state consent. My proposal is better and well within the jurisdiction of the City Council. To protect families from annual double-digit water rate increases I would allow coop and other residential homeowners to deduct any water rate increase above inflation from their property taxes. This would cap water rate increases to the rate of inflation.

In view of the exponentially rising property taxes and water use charges, will you support returning the cost of water supply and treatment facilities capital expenses to New York City's capital budget? Yes____ No ____ I need more clarity on this question in order to give a more complete answer. As an accountant, I certainly agree that capital expenditures should be part of the capital budget of the city.

This has been clearly documented in numerous press reports. I would have quarterly roundtable discussions with civic presidents and present them with the pool of available funds. We would discuss the best use of these funds and reach a consensus to maximize the benefits to the community. By doing it this way, we take the power brokering out of the equation and eliminate the vote buying scenario that all too often sees discretionary funds channeled to family or politically connected organizations. By putting the power into the hands of Civic Leaders who are fully engaged in the community as Volunteers, we will best serve the needs of the community. |
