Award to Civic Leader Jim Trent

The Queens Civic Congress [QCC] holds a its 3rd Queens Civic Luncheon, Sunday, April 14, 1:00 p.m., at Antun's of Queens Village, 96-43 Springfield Boulevard, announced President Sean M. Walsh. “Under Jim Trent's leadership, the Colonial Farmhouse Restoration Society made Queens County Farm Museum a leading destination for visitors for visitors to cultural institutions,” said QCC President Walsh in announcing the award to be presented by Queens Borough President Helen Marshall.
